Knowledge Rating: Trawling and the Wonders of the Inter-coastal Waterway

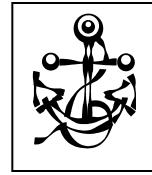

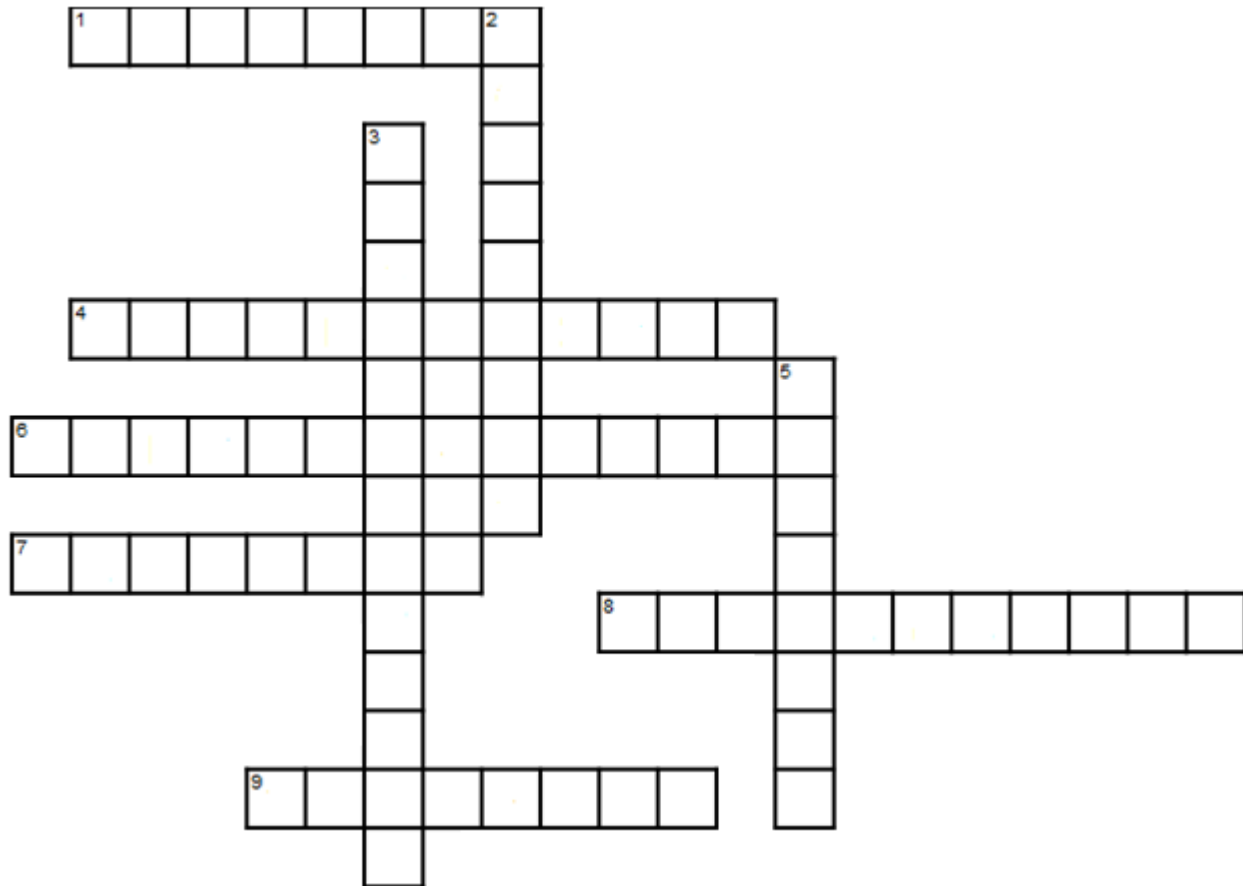
